




Must-Read Books for the Holidays



The holiday season is a time for happiness, gratitude, and even some long awaited relaxation. Why not cozy up next to the fire with one of these new holiday YA books?

Rachel Cohn and David Levithan's *The Twelve Days of Dash & Lily* is a stellar sequel to their beloved *Dash & Lily's Book of Dares*. Readers can follow Lily, Dash, and all their favorite characters as they travel to the Big Apple to make the last 12 days before Christmas memorable. Once again, Cohn and Levithan have created a lively novel that encapsulates the varying emotions of teen love and life as a teenager, but this time, with a holiday twist!



Another fantastic read for this holiday season is Jay Asher's new novel *What Light*. This dazzling tale follows Sierra, a girl who, with her family, moves from their comfortable home in Oregon every year to California to set up their Christmas tree lot for the holidays. Like most years, Sierra tries to limit her relationships because she doesn't want to get too close with someone before having to go right back to Oregon. However, this year she meets a boy, Caleb, who has a troublesome past that he must confront and she is determined to help him find forgiveness for what he's done. This brilliant book from the author of *Thirteen Reasons Why* examines the complicated story of two teens trying to face their pasts, redeem their futures, and possibly find true love in the process.
